Upcoming Activities

Band Camp

Band Camp is the time for the band, color guard, and staff to get together before the start of school to begin to practice marching, learn the drill for the new year, as well as learn the new music. The plan (weather permitting) will be to march in the morning and practice music indoors in the afternoon. Students should dress for the weather and wear suitable shoes (No Sandals) for marching. Please make sure that your child brings water. An extra large ½ gallon insulated container, clearly marked with their name, is ideal. The boosters will be providing water for those that need it, but there is convenience to not having to wait in a line to get to the water cooler (time on the field is very precious). If your performer does not drive and isn't going to eat lunch with friends or their section, please pick them up at noon and return them by 1:25 so they are on time for a 1:30 start. Timing at the end of each day is critical. The staff cannot leave until all the students have departed or have been picked up, please be respectful of their time.

Marching Exhibition and Burger Bash

Friday August 6th is the wrap-up of band camp and the kids get to show off what they have learned. This is also our first opportunity of the year for a Booster Meeting. Festivities start at 4:45 with the performers going through the food line first, and our band families after. This is a great time for the kids to celebrate their successful camp and the staff to put them through their paces on the field in their first official performance. This is also the night of the Mini-Marching competition. This fun event is a competition pitting the top 3 sections from preliminaries against each other in a marching showcase. Will the Color Guard defend their title and retain front-of-the-line privileges for meals? This is a great event to bring families to and we look forward to packing the stands for this exciting performance.

The Band boosters will provide and prepare the meat, and students are asked to bring their assigned items to the band room during the week of August 2nd but before 8:30 AM on Thursday August 5th (PLEASE don't wait until the day of the Burger Bash as we will have to purchase anything that we have a shortage of before the event.)

Our Board will be on-hand all evening to answer your questions, collect assessments and man the Grill and the Spirit Sales Trailer. Come hungry, Come with your checkbook, and Come looking for ways that you can support this awesome program though volunteering or the purchase of an item to support the band. Again this year, the Ways & Means team will be conducting a drawing for a free annual marching assessment at the event. The tickets will be \$5 each with 5 tickets for \$20. You must be present to win. And if you have already paid the assessment and win, we will happily return your paid assessment. Good Luck

The first booster meeting of the year will begin at 6:00 PM on August 6th and will be action packed. There is a lot on our plate this year and we will be excited to share our plans with you. Please make every effort to attend. Weather permitting the Burger Bash and Booster Meeting are scheduled for the stadium at Memorial. Once the booster meeting is over the kids take the field and they will show off what they have learned during Band Camp.

Bulldog Bash – Saturday August 14th

This event is a celebration of the upcoming school year and a launch to the Fall Sports Program. It consists of a Marching Band Exhibition, a Football Scrimmage and a call-out to the other fall activities. It is a festive environment with all the groups being represented by a booth and many have t-shirts or other goodies to sell. We will have our own Spirit Sales Trailer at the event. This is an evening performance; keep an eye out in the Band Notes for the call-time.

Pictures and Evening Rehearsal – Tuesday August 10th 4:00 PM – 7:00 PM

A professional photographer will be on-hand to take your performers picture in uniform. This is your chance to order keepsake pictures to send out to all the proud family members to celebrate your child's membership in Edmond's Own Bulldog Band. Parents this is also your opportunity to order your picture buttons for the new year. Make sure to ask your student about the order forms towards the end of band camp. This will also be a rehearsal.

Important Information

Assessments

The Bulldog Booster organization collects an annual assessment to cover just a portion of the costs associated with the year-long band program. Again this year, the school budget is being slashed and without our support the band program at Memorial couldn't survive. This one-time annual assessment is \$175 per music performer and covers a variety of expenses, including but not limited to:

- Clinicians and Technicians to support our program
- The Music and Marching Programs for the Band and Color Guard
- A Band Polo for each student (a new polo is given Freshman and Junior years)
- Marching Gloves (percussion gets wrist bands)
- Meals and various snacks at contests and other events
- Directors fees not covered by school funding
- Supplies critical for the program
- Marching Uniform dry-cleaning (once a year)
- A White uniform t-shirt (a new shirt each year)
- Water and Fruit at each football game
- Uniform and Equipment Maintenance
- Other Program expenses as approved by the Board and Boosters

In an effort to being sensitive to families with multiple children being in the activity at the same time, the Board has agreed to the following discount program. The first student is charged an assessment of \$175 and each subsequent student is eligible for a 50% discount of their Band Assessment. This means that each additional student will be \$87.50 vs. \$175. If the additional performer is in the Color Guard they can reduce their assessment by \$87.50 not by 50%. This discount applies to students in the same household. We hope this helps 😊

One significant distinction between our program and others of this size and stature is the assessment. Comparable programs operate in a significantly different manner; from inclusion in the band being by audition only, to an assessment which is more than double (sometimes 5 times the cost). We intentionally are keeping the Band Assessment as low as we can and still manage the needs of the organization. One critical way that you can help is to assist us by augmenting the assessment by giving of your time in one of our fundraising opportunities. A few hours from each of our parents over the course of the year, will make a significant impact on our program.

If you have any questions about the assessment, please chat with a member of the board. Assessments are due at the Burger Bash on the 6th of August. While virtually all of our expenses are front-loaded in the beginning of the year, if you need to investigate an extended payment schedule please contact our Treasurers: Debra Johnson or Tracey Romano. A presentation of our full budget for the year will be delivered during our Booster Meeting on the 6th.

Assessments can be paid in person by check at the Burger Bash, or you may go online and follow the links to pay your assessment using PayPal. You do not need a PayPal account and this is an easy alternative if you would like to pay with your credit or debit card.

Our Color Guard has a significantly higher assessment and they conduct additional fundraisers to help offset their higher expenses. We also set-aside a portion of their assessment for our general program fund and are grateful for their contribution to the program as well as their ownership for their increased expenses. If you have any questions about the guard, Anita Haftman is the liaison between the Board and the Color Guard.

Calendars/Band Directory

A tentative Calendar for the year will be available at the Burger Bash and will also be available electronically at www.bulldogband.com. The calendar is subject to change but historically is fairly accurate. Our directory is an electronic directory and is housed in Volunteer Matters at www.bulldogband.com. The directory information is sortable and can be exported for whatever format you may envision. It includes student and parent information. We are investigating a return to a hard-copy directory this year and worst-case will make a printable version available securely as a PDF online through Volunteer Matters.

Marching Contests

The Bulldog Band performs at several contest during the marching year, parents and families are invited to come watch us perform. The contests are listed in the calendar and you will be able to find additional information about each event at www.bulldogband.com. The host schools typically charge an admission for each event and it ranges from \$7 to \$15 dollars per adult. For the OBA (Oklahoma Bandmasters Association) Class 6A Championship each year the event makes a block of tickets available for us through pre-sale. This is a great opportunity to watch this exciting event with all the other rabid Bulldog fans. Listen for more to come in October about pre-sale tickets.

At each marching contest an army of volunteers is called to action to support our more than 200 performers and staff. Typically 2 meals are prepared at each event, this entails: advance preparation, meal preparation, serving and clean-up. You have never seen a more appreciative bunch of kids, and it is a blast to be around such a wonderful group of kids and parents. In addition to these tasks we need Plume Babes, on-field support, uniform crew and other functions to ensure ours is one of the smoothest running, fun-filled camps of all our peers. And we all know that compared to the Bulldogs; there is no competition ☺

For each contest we also need volunteer Bus Sponsors. These willing volunteers assist us by riding on a bus with the performers and keeping an eye on things as well as making sure everyone is accounted for. Then once we get to the contest site you get to help us set up “camp” and prepare and serve meals and other critical tasks, necessary for our success. If you are planning on going to a contest anyway, this is an excellent way to save some gas, not have to worry about parking and spend a fulfilling day with the greatest kids in the history of earth, and a bunch of really cool passionate band parents. Even if you just aren't sure yet, make sure you stop by our “camp” at a contest and check it out, we can always use the help.

Uniforms

Marching Uniform

A marching uniform will be assigned to students and securely kept in a band trailer or the uniform room and is checked out by the student at each event. They will even be trained on the appropriate way to care for and hang up the uniform as the uniform is a symbol of our team and the pride we all have in being Bulldogs. At the end of the season our contracted dry-cleaner will pick up the uniforms clean them and return them back to us. This expense is already included in the annual assessment. The marching uniform will also include their white t-shirt and gloves (distributed early in the fall), their shoes, black socks, and the marching hat which they will keep at home and bring to performances. The hat is the most often forgotten item, every Friday night there can be seen a string of parents walking down to the field-level with a hat box and a frown.

At the discretion of the Band Staff, they may elect that the kids will not wear their marching uniform, and instead wear what is termed the Warm Weather Uniform. This is a required uniform and consists of a pair of Black Pants, the Maroon Polo issued by the Boosters during the students Freshman and Junior years, black socks and the black marching shoes. A couple of performances, especially early in the year, include a pair a khaki shorts and “mostly white” tennis shoes with the Polo Shirt.

If your student needs another Polo Shirt and it isn't “their year” or you just want them to have an extra. We will have them available for purchase at the Spirit Sales Trailer during Band Camp. During Band Camp they will be a special price of just \$15, after that they will be \$20 and available at all the Home football games from the Spirit Sales Trailer.

Marching Shoes

Every student must have a pair of Black MTX marching shoes. If they are still in good condition from the previous year please feel free to re-use or if now just a bit snug you may be able to pass them along to another band member. The shoes will be ordered during band camp and are typically \$35.00. These shoes are for performances only, not rehearsals and band practices.

Alterations

Some uniforms will be sent home with instructions to hem the pants. Hems should never be cut, stapled or taped – only stitch hemmed. Under no circumstances should any other alterations be made to the uniforms. These uniforms are quite an investment and are used year to year. In some but not all cases, a student may get the same uniform from year to year. If you choose to have a tailor complete the uniform hem, that expense cannot be reimbursed or deducted from your assessment. If you have questions about the uniform or need help with getting the hem completed, please contact a member of the Board and we will find a resource to assist you.

Concert Uniform

Boys

The concert uniform for boys is Black dress slacks, Black dress shoes with Black socks, a Black Bow tie and a White Tuxedo Style shirt. The shirt and tie are available from many retailers, including Hobby Lobby and JC Penny. Maroon concert blazers are issued to the boys in the fall and are to be kept at home. At the end of the year, the blazer needs to be dry-cleaned and returned to the school with the receipt from the cleaner attached to the dry-cleaning bag.

Girls

The concert uniform for the girls is all black. They may wear tea-length or longer dresses or skirts (halfway between knee and ankle is appropriate). Please no bare midriff or bare shoulders. Also please make sure that they have black dress shoes (not open-toed sandals, flats are perfectly ok and black hose). Black Slacks are certainly ok as well, please no black jeans or black khakis.

The appearance of the performers in all events is a key component of the overall program. It leads to a sense of team, the confidence of the performance and reflects positively in what it means to be a Bulldog. Attention should not be drawn to an individual because of clothing, just the same as during the performance the band operates and focuses as one unit. Please don't let your student be talked into wearing black converse or other inappropriate material by an upperclassman.

Events and other "Stuff"

Special Performances

There are 2 annual family events to come and listen to the band perform, eat, meet other band families, have a booster meeting and yes we will eat. Our Ice Cream Social is in October and our Chili Cook Off/Silent Auction is typically in early March. These events are family friendly, the kids will always eat first and then perform after the Booster meeting each night. We ask for volunteers to help serve and clean up as well as ask for volunteers to make up a batch of potentially award winning chili or help us by providing items or services for the Silent Auction. There is no charge for the Ice Cream Social, but a nominal fee for the Chili Cook Off. In years past the Silent Auction has been a great fundraiser for us and we look forward to another successful event.

DVD's and CD's

Each year our marching program performs at the Oklahoma Bandmasters Association Class 6A State Championships and a DVD is commercially produced for the event. Depending on which performances you choose the cost varies from \$10 - \$25. The options are just the Memorial performance or all the band's participating in the Finals of the event. This is not a fundraiser for the Boosters but we do manage the ordering and distribution of the DVD's.

At the end of each year there is an opportunity to purchase a compilation CD of all the musical performances from that year. The CD's are available for pick-up in the Fall and a limited quantity will still be available to purchase for \$10.

Fall Trip

For the first time the Bulldog Band will be participating in the Bands of America (BOA) Super-Regional Competition in St. Louis. There are 3 Super-Regional's conducted across the country and the participation is limited to 60 marching bands total across the 3 events. This is a major milestone for the Bulldog Band program and represents a culmination of several years of hard work by our staff and performers. The event will be held in the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis, the home of the NFL St. Louis Rams. The preliminary rounds are scheduled for Friday and Saturday with the top 14 bands advancing to the Finals Saturday night. The dates for our fall trip to St. Louis are October 14th – 18th. There are tons more details to come about this exciting trip and parents are of course needed to travel with the band for this exciting trip. Many of you have already made your first payments for the trip, Thank You. Everyone else please make sure that you have submitted your first 2 trip payments by the time the Burger Bash comes along on the 6th of August. Mrs. Feroli is still working out the details as to the total cost, the agenda, and the amount that our parent Bus Sponsors will pay. Stay tuned for more information to come and you can always check out www.bulldogband.com for the latest information. This year the Fall trip to BOA will take the place of the typical Spring Trip. Your student will engage in a very structured itinerary that is closely monitored by the Band Staff and Volunteer chaperones. In addition to the marching contest the kids will have an opportunity to do some sightseeing and other activities. To ensure the best possible result for this event it will take participation from all the band members. Parents you can sign up to be a Bus Sponsor online in Volunteer Matters.

The cost of the trip will cover transportation, most meals, hotel stay, tickets to the Super-Regional contest, and area attractions such as the St. Louis Arch. Students will have the opportunity in August to participate in the Magazine Fundraiser in which the funds they raise can be applied to each student's trip balance. Publicity

Our Board is also active on the publicity front to showcase our fabulous students and performers. While we do have some publicity that is managed and directed by the school administration, our creative team is always on the lookout for unique opportunities to show off Edmond's Own Bulldog Band. Historian and Alumni Outreach

Last year the Board and Boosters approved the creation of a Historian and Alumni Board position. This team is full of exciting ideas that will demonstrate the Legacy of Edmond's Own Bulldog Band. If you are a Bulldog Band alum or you have a student that has already graduated, please have them contact Janet Anderson or Ron Griffin to find out how they can participate in our Alumni organization.

Fundraisers

Did you know that the Band program at Memorial relies on the strength of OUR organization to meet its mission of providing an outstanding music experience for our student performers? To that end we prepare a budget every year that includes the student assessment as a portion of the total needs of the program and that the balance is made up of fundraisers and creative ways of employing community support. The Music Education

department budget is continually shrinking and we will continue to be asked to step up our level of support. Especially as our program becomes even more successful, it will require more and more of an investment to keep improving and growing. Thank You for your continued support as we accelerate our already successful program onto a regional and maybe even national stage.

In addition to fundraisers that the students participate in to support their annual trip, the Boosters Ways and Means committee is constantly on the lookout for fundraising ideas that will add value to our program and these range from items sold from our very own Spirit Sales Trailer at School functions and Football Games, to the Chili Cook-Off, to manning the concession stands at Bulldog Home football games at UCO, Otis Spunkmeyer Cookie Dough, and partnering with Applebee's for a Flapjack Fundraiser pancake breakfast. In the past we have had other successful events including a Golf Outing, if you have a creative idea or would like to help plan a successful fundraising event, please contact a member of our Ways and Means Committee, Sharla Taylor, Tracey Garrett or Dale Garrett.

One successful way that we support the program is by manning the concession stands at Bulldog Home Football games that are held at UCO's Wantland Stadium. For some games we will be manning both the Home and Visitor Sides. This is an important fundraiser for us and part of our long-term strategy for an even more successful program. Your help is greatly appreciated. If you can please identify just one game to help, that will go a long way. Last year we had a small dedicated group of volunteers that picked up the baton, but unfortunately they were the only ones and a few folks didn't get a chance to watch a single game or any halftime performances of the fabulous Bulldog Band. The Spirit Sales trailer will be making appearances at Band Camp, the Burger Bash and the Bulldog Bash the Ways and Means team is going to be marketing some must-have items for our passionate Bulldog and Bulldog Band supporters.

One of the first fundraising events will be the first of two Flapjack Fundraisers September 18th at Applebee's on Broadway Extension. The event will be held from 7 AM to 10 AM and tickets can be purchased in advance from the Spirit Sales Trailer at any of our events for \$7.00 for Adults, \$5.00 for kids 3-10 and under 3 eats for free. This is a very profitable event as out of the \$7.00 for adults Applebee's only charges us \$1.85 which is a profit of more than 73%. This has the potential of being one of the most successful 3 hour programs in our fundraising repertoire. Again parent volunteers will be valuable for this event and you will be able to sign up online after you have completed your Volunteer Matters enrollment.

After our Home Football Games the band heads over to CiCi's for pizza, fellowship and to watch a video of the night's performance. The Ways and Means team is again involved as they collect a "cover charge" at the door. The cover charge includes the salad bar, the all you can eat pizza buffet, drinks and a place for our kids to hang out in a safe environment. Parents are welcome to join us, and even if you don't intend on eating you will still be asked to pay the "cover". The CiCi's nights will be highlighted on the calendar and the weekly Band Note from Mrs. Feroli.

In January and March we will be partnering with Memorial to deliver 2 Pizza Days in the Commons and the Freshman Academy. A handful of parents also help make this a great success. Volunteer Matters will be the place to go to sign up for a spot.

We also hold fundraisers for dedicated projects. One example of such a fundraiser is to support our Annual Scholarship Drive. Each year we try to raise enough money to fund scholarships to support some of our graduating seniors. Each applicant submits an application which is reviewed by the Scholarship Committee. Criteria for evaluation include: the student prepared essay, recommendations by the Band Staff, and the merits of each application. To qualify for a scholarship your student is not required to pursue a degree in Music. Be on the lookout for applications in the spring and our fundraising efforts throughout the year. If you have questions about our scholarship program Theresa Tunison is here to help.

I am also compelled to call out the last named member of the board, Jacque Young is our Secretary, she plays a critical role in the success of the Board by trying to wrangle all of us during our meetings and capture all the details that support all our efforts.

You likely noticed the gap on the first page; we still have an open position on our Board this year. The role of the Vice President. If you are the least bit intrigued and would like to become a part of our team, please let any member of the Board know.

In closing, you can see, there is a lot that goes into this awesome band of ours and not only can we not do it without your help, we wouldn't want to try.
